Interim police chief looking to become Kremmling's next chief

Jesse Lisenby moved to Kremmling and worked for Kremmling Police Department from November 2020 – August 2021, during the “black years” of the pandemic. He recently accepted the position as the interim police chief and now intends to apply as the town’s permanent chief.

Originally from Orange County in southeast Texas, Lisenby says that he was interested in law enforcement as a youngster but instead decided to pursue a criminal justice degree at Sam Houston University.

Upon graduation, the “war on terror was still going on,” and Lisenby decided to join the Army, making it through their special forces contract and becoming involved with a special forces team. After 5 years, his enlistment was coming to an end, and “after some soul searching,” he decided to separate from the army and pursue a career in law enforcement.

Lisenby went to work near his hometown for the Beaumont (Texas) Police Department. He was with the Beaumont PD during Hurricane Harvey. His wife, Jennifer, was a nurse at the same time, and they were both extremely involved in helping their community survive and recover.

After 6 years, Jesse and Jennifer wanted to move to a location further from the coast he had the opportunity to move to and

work for the Fort Worth Police Department for a couple of years.

An avid fly fisherman, Lisenby came to Colorado on a solo fishing trip and “stumbled upon Kremmling” while looking for some good spots to fish. Enjoying his time on the Colorado River, Jesse returned with Jennifer the following year. They stayed at the Easton, breakfasted at the Moose Cafe, met local business owners, and decided to see “if they need police officers here.”

He applied for police chief at that time and made it to the top 3. Former Town Manager Dan Stoltman offered him a position as an officer, and Lisenby agreed to a temporary position, knowing he would soon begin construction on his home.

In August 2021, Jesse resigned as a police officer to work on building his home full-time but was approached recently by a Kremmling board member to consider becoming the interim police chief.

He initially took the job “site unseen” and received a warm welcome from the town and the community. When asked about becoming the permanent police chief, Lisenby remarked, “I wanted to make sure it would be a good fit for my wife and me. I like what I see.” He believes he can build on the stability created by former Chief Rivera.


“Policing has gotten a stigma – some of it earned. It’s not a law enforcement vs civilian thing,”

Lisenby noted. It’s his belief that police officers must remember that they not only protect a community but are part of a community. He feels it’s easier to do that here where officers can strike up conversations and create relationships.

As chief, Lisenby doesn’t plan on making any big, sweeping changes,

but will insist that this community mentality remain and grow. “It will be a lead-by-example type of thing,” he explained. He likes the officers he has and expects that they would stop by the basketball games and visit with business owners regularly.

“I’d like the KPD to be perceived as an approachable, reputable agency. If you feel that it’s not or need something, give me a call or stop by, and I’ll do what I can.”

Fishing with Bernie

Ice fishing is in full swing in Grand County!

Grand Lake - 6-8" of ice with about 8" of snow on top – slushy in areas. Fishing has been excellent for rainbows and browns in the early mornings in less than 12 ft of water. Small tungsten jigs tipped with wax worms, micro tube jigs, or small jointed Clam Pinhead spoons have all been producing. Lake trout have been fair in 30-50ft of water with small glow grub or black grub tipped with a small piece of sucker.

Lake Granby - 3-4" of ice. There is some foot traffic, but we have not seen any machines out yet. The heavy snow brought lots of slush. We need some consecutive cold nights to firm things up. Fishing has been very good for all species. Look for the best rainbow trout action in Cutthroat Bay up in the shallows early and late in the day. Small tungsten jig tipped with gulp minnow, or Clam Silkie has been producing well. Lake trout bite has been very good in 20-60ft of water. Small natural color tubes, grubs, or brightly colored spoons tipped with sucker have been producing

good bites from under 20" fish.

Williams Fork - 8"+ of ice throughout the lake with about 6" snow cover on top. Water level is 48%. Bite for lake trout has been very good. Focus on your numbers and fish in 30-60' of water; radical glow grub or Clam Leach Flutter spoons worked on the bottom have been producing. The large lake trout bite has been very good as well, up-size your baits, large tubes, and minnow imitations and be willing to drill some holes to chase down that elusive bite. The rainbow and kokanee action has been slow due to no recent stocking as CPW combats the gill lice.

The Fishing with Bernie team has been guiding in Grand County for over 25 years.

BLM releases information on Blue Valley Ranch Exchange

Vital Blue Valley Ranch Land Exchange Document Finally Released to Public

After over a year of Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests and litigation, the BLM finally released a document key to understanding the controversial Blue Valley Ranch land exchange.

[Kremmling, CO, January 10, 2023] — Colorado Wild Public Lands (CWPL), a public lands watchdog group, recently achieved the public release of the Binding Land Exchange Agreement for the Blue Valley Ranch land exchange proposed near

Kremmling, CO. This document is vital to the public's understanding of the exchange, yet the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) declined to release it publicly for over a year after being requested through the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

CWPL first filed for the public release of this document in July 2021. The BLM originally responded with a document consisting of a cover page followed by 90 completely redacted pages. Meanwhile, a fully unredacted version of this document was freely shared with the private entities who seek to benefit from this exchange.

After a year of stonewalled attempts to receive an unredacted version, CWPL filed a FOIA lawsuit against the BLM in July 2022. Nearly 5 months later, the BLM released an unredacted copy of this document to the public on December 7, 2022, which can be viewed at coloradowildpubliclands.org.

CWPL views this document release as a victory for public information access, however it nonetheless highlights the problematic and borderline secretive practices behind many public land exchanges. The organization advocates that the public deserves at least as much

access to public land exchange information as those private interests who seek to benefit from them.

COWPL works to protect the integrity of Colorado's public lands by advocating for transparency and public engagement in federal land exchanges. The organization monitors land exchanges to ensure compliance with applicable laws and regulations and to ensure that the public interest is represented throughout the process. Snow Removal Reminders:

Obstructing a town road by plowing snow across the right-of-way or into the right-of-way is not allowed per state law. Also, the property owner may be liable for any injury attributable to a hazard that they have created in the public right-of-way.

Primary roads will have the first priority during heavy snowfall with secondary roads being cleared as soon as possible thereafter.

(Public school bus route is primary)

Please do not allow children to play on the edge of the road in the snow berms.

Property owners are responsible for the removal of snow from their driveways and the snow that may be left in front of the driveway due to the town removing snow from the streets.

Parking any vehicle or trailer in the right-of-way is not allowed and is subject to ticket and or towing. We will use all of the 60' right-of-way to move snow off the main portion of the street.

Placing roll-off dumpsters in the right-of-way is not allowed.

Town does not remove snow from the public alleys.

All Town Board of Trustee (3rd Thursday of each month) and Planning & Zoning Commission meetings (1st Thursday) are open to the general public and are held at 513 Aspen Street in Hot Sulphur Springs at 6:30 p.m.

Cozens Ranch is getting a new roof

Since its establishment in the 1870s, Cozens Ranch Museum has attracted both locals and visitors and has been a welcome to Fraser Valley. Once you arrived at Cozens Ranch, you arrived in the Fraser Valley. The ability to continue this welcoming tradition was put at risk as over the years heavy snowfall, ice dams, and general wear and tear have damaged the roof. The damage has resulted in major leaking within the building the past two winters. Consistent leaks from the roof have put thousands of artifacts at risk of damage and continue to threaten the integrity of the building.

This year our greatest fundraising cause was to raise the necessary funds to replace the cedar shake roof which came with a very heavy cost of \$86,000. At our annual fundraiser, "Sunday at the Ranch," with a matching donation from a local family, we raised \$30,000. GCHA is pleased to announce that in December we were awarded \$67,245 from the State Historical Fund for the replacement of the roof on the Cozens Ranch Museum and Stagestop in Fraser.

This is such a huge weight lifted off our shoulders to know that we

have the funds needed and we can begin on this project in the spring. Cozens Ranch holds a special place in our hearts and in many of our local families' memories and we are so excited to keep this historic building alive! Thank you to everyone in the community who has donated this year to this cause and supported our efforts.

The Cozens family moved to the Fraser Valley in the 1870s from Central City, Colorado. Their property served as a working ranch, stagecoach stop, inn, restaurant, and post office. The property was used as a summer retreat by the Catholic Church until the 1980s. During this time, the church began selling the land to developers. The remaining house, post office, and stagecoach stop had fallen into disrepair. A group of volunteers with the support of the Town of Fraser rallied to save Cozens. Through these efforts, the property was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1988.

Once restoration work was completed, Cozens Ranch opened as a museum in 1991. With the new roof, Cozens Ranch will continue to create special memories for locals and visitors alike.

Victims recovered from fatal avalanche on Corona Pass

On January 7, 2023, at approximately 2:15 p.m. the Grand County Sheriff's Office along with Grand County EMS, Grand County Search and Rescue, and a Winter Park Ski Patrol Dog Team responded to a report of an avalanche on Corona Pass in the area of Mount Epworth/Deadman Lake near the town of Winter Park in unincorporated Grand County. Initial reports were that two snowmobilers had become buried in the avalanche.

According to the press release, emergency responders, with the assistance of citizens in the area, were

able to recover one of the individuals, who was identified as a 58-year-old male from Northern Colorado. Despite emergency resuscitation efforts, this victim was pronounced deceased on the scene and was transferred to the Grand County Coroner's Office. Responders were unable to locate the second buried male victim and were forced to retreat from the area due to weather and safety concerns.

Early Sunday morning, January 8, 2023, teams from the Grand County Sheriff's Office, Grand County Search and Rescue, Grand County EMS - Mountain Medical

Response Team, Winter Park Ski Patrol, Flight for Life, and the Colorado Avalanche Information Center (CAIC), returned to the avalanche area to continue search and rescue efforts for the second victim.

Shortly before 11 a.m., a 52-year-old male from Northern Colorado was located, recovered, and subsequently transferred to the Grand County Coroner's Office. The identities of the decedents and the official cause and manner of their deaths will be released by the

Coroner's Office when appropriate. Grand County Sheriff Brett Schroetlin shared, "Unfortunately, this is the second fatal avalanche that we have experienced this season in Grand County. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of the victims. We encourage those recreating in our backcountry to regularly monitor the conditions and follow the advice of our avalanche professionals at Colorado Avalanche Information Center (CAIC)."

Also, GCLD collaborates with many local non-profits:


- Grand Beginnings teaches early literacy classes and partners with GCLD on sensory and literacy kits that patrons can check out from the library




