Town of Kremmling January Update

On Wednesday, January 18, 2023, the Kremmling Board of Trustees held their regular meeting at 200 Eagle Ave, Kremmling, Colorado at 6:00 p.m.

Public Comments:

Jeff Ward gave a few suggestive comments on the subject of snow removal and ordinances pertaining to the usage of ATVs on public roads.

Mayoral Announcements,

proclamations, and appointments:

Town Manager Ashley MacDonald stated in the meeting, "There are very specific statutory responsibilities that the Clerk and the Treasurer provide. Teagan Serres has been providing a significant amount of these duties already. The primary goal of the Treasurer is to serve certifications to the county for things like utility leans."

MacDonald stated that over the past nine months, Serres has been working hard to accomplish the duties of this role and has been operating the duties of the Clerk in every capacity except for conducting an official election. "Other than executing an official election on her own, Teagan has been completing all of the duties of the Clerk position and exceeding expectations,' MacDonald stated praising Serres.

After the comments made by the Town Manager the Board of Trustees made a unanimous vote to move the

title and responsibilities of interim-Treasurer/Clerk from Town Manager MacDonald to Teagan Serres.

Mayor Pryor lead Serres in the oath of office and swore her in as the Town Clerk/Treasurer. **County Presentation**

County Commissioner, Randy George presented the 2023 Bi-Annual Update, Grand County Board of Commissioners.


In the presentation, the Commissioner noted that the decision had been made that when Interstate 70 closes, County Road 1 (Trough Road) in Grand and Eagle Counties would also be closed to everyone except local traffic. This is due to the high volume of traffic on that road during both the winter and summer seasons.

County road 22 was resurfaced this summer, which has resulted in a lower speed limit on that road until it can be corrected.

West Grand Future **Business Leaders of America** (FBLA) Presentation

Lorena Lott and Sam Miller from West Grand School District presented to the Board of Trustees a presentation on the West Grand Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA).

The group of 18 students will be going to Japan and was looking to the Board of Trustees to give a financial

donation toward the \$12,939 needed for two bids that gave presentations: the trip. The students are responsible for raising funds, purchasing their luggage fees, passports, and tips that will be required to give to bus drivers giving tours.

This is the third trip that Lott will lead and the first trip she has led with West Grand School District. The trip is from July 6 - 15, which was strategically placed so that no school time will be missed. Students are currently studying the country in preparation for the trip. Students will get to experience a zen garden, local shrines, and a tea ceremony among many other adventures.

The school is in collaboration with EF Tours, which will be giving high school credit to the students for free. Sam Miller stated the importance and life lessons given to students who get to participate in programs FBLA.

Trustees asked what other types of fundraising the group has been doing in efforts to raise funds. Lott stated that concession stands have been the number one means of raising funds for the group, but with many students working jobs and involved in extracurricular activities, it has been hard to find time to fundraise. Lott reiterated that the students were raising funds on an individual level.

The board is considering the request.

Mosquito Mitigation Contract: As stated in the Executive

Summary on page 33 of the Board Packet, "Due to the local use of flood irrigation and unique species of mosquito that live in the valley, the Town considers, reviews, and executes a contract annually for mosquito services." The Board of Trustees brought

motioned to table this discussion for a special meeting to take place after February 1 work meeting.

Kremmling Town Pavilion: In 2021 the pavilion was deemed an unsafe structure, and since then meetings have been held to decide which route the town should go in efforts to replace the pavilion. In November 2022, the pavilion was taken down while plans were still being discussed.

Dillon Wilson shared his appreciation of members of the town showing interest in the pavilion and their desire to make Kremmling a more beautiful place. Michele Mierzykowski brought a plan (placed in the January 19 edition of the Grand Gazette on page 6) and presented it to the board for consideration.

Town Manager MacDonald informed the board that the town attorney clarified that the board was not subject to bidding out the design of the pavilion; however, the construction and labor would need to be publicly bid on. The town would then be responsible for contract oversight and performance.

The board unanimously approved the Kremmling Town Pavilion project presentation not to exceed \$115,000.

Water Treatment Plant Project Needs Assessment:

The board unanimously agreed and voted to approve the project needs assessment for the Water Treatment Plant. A plan is being put in place to get grants to help pay for the new facility.





Processing of Colorado state income tax to begin soon

by the Colorado Department of Revenue

The Colorado Department of Revenue (CDOR) announced that processing for the majority of state income tax filers will begin no later than February 10, 2023, and that people can still file their income tax returns right now through all methods with the exception of the state's Revenue Online platform.

Online to file their state income taxes no later than February 22, 2023.

Last November Coloradans voted to lower the income tax rate to 4.4%, which coupled with multiple legislative changes, created a much larger endof-year programming workload for the Department, resulting in a slight delay. "The Department's employees

as fast as possible to reduce any inconvenience this may have for taxpayers," said Mark Ferrandino, executive director of the Department of Revenue. "We are committed to making sure our systems are thoroughly tested to prevent any errors that could result in additional delays in processing returns and refunds for Colorado taxpayers after the fact."

The Department will strive to beat the deadlines, with the aforementioned dates being the absolute latest the Department anticipates the delays to persist. Upto-date information on the delay can be found by going to tax.colorado. gov and clicking on the banner.

Why was my tax return rejected by the IRS?

There are many reasons e-filed returns are rejected by the IRS each year. These tips will help you e-file your return quickly and without errors.

Filing without all W-2s. Tax returns cannot be legally processed by using paystubs or other wage documents. A W-2 is required and employers should have mailed them as of January 31.

Inaccurate Social Security Numbers or Names. Each SSN and Name on a return should appear exactly as printed on the Social Security card.

Incorrect Filing Status. Some tax payers choose the wrong filing status. If in doubt, please ask a professional tax preparer.

Math mistakes. Math errors are some of the most common mistakes. Always check your math.

Figuring credits or deductions yourself. Tax Payers can make mistakes

figuring things like their Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, and Dependent Care Credit. A professional tax preparer can avoid these mistakes, as well as using a trusted software.

Incorrect bank numbers. Taxpayers who are due a refund should choose direct deposit. This is the fastest way to get their money. Be sure to verify routing and account numbers.

Unsigned forms. An unsigned tax return isn't valid. If Married Filing Jointly, both spouses must sign. Some rare exceptions may apply.





Bill enjoyed the camaraderie of the artists and friends he made at the gallery, and It was a nice addition to the town.

He was a tough yet sentimental man. He loved his family with everything he had. He always stood by his daughters; even if he didn't agree, he'd always have their back because as he would say, "You're my kid." He was always there to give good advice, a hug, and a pat on the back.

Bill was a man of his word and his word was good on a handshake. He was truly one of the good guys. He often would speak of the old days and reminisce about their lives together and get tears in his eyes remembering it fondly.

Heather and Shannon have spent the last year (almost to the day) with Bill, each staying for a week and looking after him and then trading off, spending precious time. His daughters are so grateful that they were able to help him carry out the wishes of his last days. We know he would have wished to leave this earth in the woods Jeremiah Johnson style because that's who he was. But he was able to stay at home this last year of his life, and aside from being on the mountain, that was exactly where he wanted to be.

Bill is survived by his daughters Shannon Janson, (Bo Jump) and Heather Wells, (Macy Wells); granddaughters Madison Jump, Robin Covington, and Brooke Wells, and grandson Benjamin Wells along with many, many friends.

Bill will be missed more than words can express. He will be with us always.

On a happy roll for tonight's relaxation, I then check into Grand County Library District's (GCLD) Hoopla Digital app, which gives mobile access to thousands of streaming movies through GCLD's website. Ahh, perfect: Tom Hanks in Castaway...a warm deserted island, you can see how my mind works when the world is white outside.

Saving the crème for my last flannel adventure, I log into the library's digital edition of the New York Times. There it is: Jancee Dunn's Op-Ed on "Can you Age Exuberantly?" This irresistible thought was derived from a new book with an equally irresistible title: The Swedish Art of Aging Exuberantly: Life Wisdom from Someone Who Will (Probably) Die Before You, written with astringent humor by Margaret Magnusson. She is 86 years old and lives in Stockholm. Magnusson's simple definition of happiness is surrounding yourself with the young and their fresh ideas to "stay in tune with the young person you yourself were at some point."

She hit a tender spot---I shed my flannel PJs for snow gear, and I and my good dog burst outside to take photos of all the young sledders who are cascading down the ten-foot-high heaps of plowed snow. The best of both worlds.


