New fishing license required effective March 31

DENVER – Colorado Parks and Wildlife reminds anglers the 2023-2024 fishing season is officially here.

The 2023-2024 fishing license is valid from March 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024. Regulations and pricing for annual, daily, and multi-day fishing licenses are in the 2023 Colorado Fishing Brochure (Pesca en Colorado (En Español)). For individuals, ages 18 through 64, an \$11.50 Habitat Stamp is required with the first license purchase for the year. Youth under age 16 can fish with one rod for free, and CPW provides opportunities throughout the season to learn how to fish.

Coloradans and non-resident visitors can purchase fishing licenses online, by phone at 1-800-244-5613, at a local CPW office, or from authorized sales agents statewide. CPW does not

receive general tax dollars and fishing license sales support all statewide hatchery and fish-stocking operations.

CPW stocks 90 million fish annually into Colorado waters to ensure quality angling opportunities. From warmer waters to mountain streams, Colorado angling opportunities are world-renowned. Funding from fishing license sales may allow for additional public access, community angling grants, and habitat improvement projects that support state birds, fish, and other small game.

"CPW biologists and volunteers will soon be spawning fish to replenish our walleye and saugeye fisheries," said CPW Aquatic Section Manager Matt Nicholl. "Our hatcheries are also stocking front range waters with trout while water temperatures remain cool for added angling opportunities."

Whether one enjoys lure fishing, ice fishing or fly fishing, Colorado provides 27,000 miles of streams and more than 1,300 lakes and reservoirs. Fishing in Colorado provides the possibility of catching 35 species of warm-water and cold-water fish. Fishing is a great activity to share with family and friends, and the perfect chance to get outside and enjoy Colorado's natural resources.

"Spring is around the corner and so is the opportunity to get out and enjoy the active, outdoor Colorado lifestyle by going fishing," said CPW Angler Education Coordinator Andre Egli. "If you are new to fishing there are many classes offered around the state. Classes are available for new anglers, families, or seasoned anglers that want to learn a new technique like fly fishing."

CPW fishing classes, events, seminars, and tournaments are posted on the Fishing News and Events web page.

Downloading the My CPW app is an excellent first step for planning one's next fishing trip. My CPW is the official mobile app for CPW's license and pass purchasing website, CPWshop.com, and includes access to a list of active products on your CPWShop.com account, CPWShop mobile purchases, links to fishing reports, PDFs of the most recent brochures and more (available to residents and non-residents). Download from Apple App Store or Google Play.

CSP Conducts Statewide Operation to Stop Distracted Driving

(COLORADO) – Grand County – Over the past three years fatal and injury crashes have significantly increased across Colorado and throughout the US. In 2022, Colorado lost 745 lives to traffic fatalities, the most roadway deaths in the state since 1981. Many of these crashes are caused by simple distractions.

Whether the distraction is a cell phone, a tasty bite to eat, or even other passengers, that distraction is definitely not worth a life.

On March 10, troopers across Colorado, in partnership with local jurisdictions, will be conducting a strict enforcement operation to bring awareness to and end distracted driving. Some of the indicators troopers will be looking for are lane violations, speeding, and careless and reckless driving behaviors.

Furthermore, troopers will be focusing attention on those highways that cross troop boundaries, giving them the maximum amount of visibility. Motorists could literally travel across the state and see troopers throughout the entire adventure. The highways that we will be focusing on are Highway 34, Highway 40, Highway 50, Highway 160, Highway 287, I-70, and I-25.

A few tips to avoid meeting one of our troopers under less-than-ideal conditions, and more importantly, do your part to avoid a tragic crash are:

- Pay close attention to speed limits. In poor weather, never drive beyond your vehicle's capabilities... slow your roll.
- Put the distractions aside. Place that cell phone out of reach, and if it is that important, pull off at the next gas station or exit ramp. Better yet, give it to your passengers and let them navigate those messages. Open those snacks before you start driving and eat messy meals somewhere other than behind the wheel. Who wants to deal with those dried tomatoes and french fries under the seat months down the road anyway?
- If you see dangerous driving actions by another motorist, slow down and keep them safely in front of you. This is a good opportunity to pull over and call *CSP. Let one of our troopers handle that dangerous issue.
- Finally, make sure everybody in the vehicle is properly buckled up and never drive impaired by alcohol or drugs.

President of the board of trustees sites benefits of being a library advocate

Are you a card-holding library user? Are you also an advocate for Grand County's libraries? If so, you can serve your community and be a supporter of the many programs, services, and access to literacy available to patrons.

Whenever my family made a move to a new home and new town, the local library was one of the first places visited in order to get a library card, meet people, and learn about the community. It was no different when my husband and I moved to Fraser in 2016. I had begun taking my grandchildren to story hours, summer reading activities, and outings years prior to our moving here.

My daughter suggested I consider applying to be a Trustee since there was an opening in District One. I have now served on the Board for 6 years, and after monthly meetings overseeing operations, monthly highlights, hiring an executive director, and witnessing fiscal responsibility, I can say it has been a worthwhile venture.

Some highlights have been that the District has achieved financial stability, celebrated the first graduation of Career Online High School graduates who earned their high school diplomas, and seen increased circulation and library use. Substantial monetary support from the Friends of the Library expanded children's summer programs and early literacy initiatives.

The resurrected Grand County Library Foundation sponsored the Community of Writers, led by Martin Smith, and supplemented the annual budget. In 2017, the resident voters approved the mil levy that paid off the debt service on Juniper and Granby Libraries. So many more successes came in spite of the pandemic. The resilience and creativity of staff made it possible for patrons to still access the physical and digital resources they needed.
