## Letter to the Editor

As a livestock producer in Jackson County, I am beyond frustrated with the Governor's decision to deny the will of the legislature and veto SB23-256, Management of Gray Wolves Reintroduction. This decision has disregarded the needs of our industry and the voices of producers, like myself.

This bill would have provided much-needed flexibility in wolf management practices to protect the livestock industry. SB23-256, with broad bipartisan support, was carefully crafted with input from various stakeholders, including livestock producers and Western slope community members.

We did not ask for wolves to be introduced into our rural communities. We did not vote for Proposition 114, which narrowly passed. Throughout the wolf introduction process, we have cooperated to ensure the introduction is successful while ensuring we have all the tools in the toolbox to protect our livelihoods. The governor's veto shows a lack of understanding of the needs of our industry and discounts the critical role that livestock producers play in our state's economy and food supply. We have attempted to mend relationships and work with our state's leadership, and in return, these choices show a lack of respect and care for our industry and communities. As our rural communities are struggling, it is disappointing to see the governor continue prioritizing political interests over the interest of Colorado's hardworking farmers and ranchers and the viability of western slope communities.

Thank you to the bill sponsors for representing and standing steadfast

with the constituents and representing the voices of the Western Slope. We applaud their ability to gather overwhelming bipartisan support for this bill. It is frustrating to see how this decision outright ignores the hard work of Colorado's elected officials throughout the legislative session to represent their constituents.

Colorado's agriculture community faces challenges daily, including the increasing frequency of extreme weather events and uncertainty in markets; they don't need to also worry about how state government officials may affect their abilities to operate. Even with this decision to veto this bill, livestock producers will continue to provide for our state, even with the impending wolf introduction. How can we work together to ensure agriculture production and producers will not be harmed through the wolf introduction process? Prop 114 specifically stated the need to "prevent and resolve conflicts between gray wolves and livestock" and livestock producers need certainty for management flexibility before wolves are introduced.

Our ask of the Governor is simple: we must work together and support the industry that feeds, clothes and fuels our state. Let's recognize the benefits that livestock producers bring to the environment, wildlife, and rural communities and work together to ensure the futures of our western slope communities.





## Fishing with Bernie



Grand Lake - Water Temp 48 degrees. Fishing for rainbow trout and brown has been excellent. Target rocky shorelines and inlets. Spoons and small crank baits in silver or bright colors have been the best producers. Early bite is a frenzy of activity, but if a storm or breeze comes in the action can pick back up quickly. Lake trout action is very good with fish being caught in 20-40 ft of water on small dark colored tubes tipped with sucker. This is an excellent time to fish on this lake, don't miss out on the great bite! Fishing with Bernie Guide, Dan Shannon.

Williams Fork Reservoir. Water level is at 65% and filling daily. Boat ramp is not open as water is still below the ramp. No estimate on opening date yet. Good action is being reported for lake trout and pike for those on shore or hand launched boats. Target the shallow bays in the afternoons for pike where the water is warmest. Spoons, glide-baits and crankbaits are getting some action. Lake trout are being caught in 25-50ft of water. Tube jigs and plastics that imitate crayfish are producing well.

Lake Granby- Water temp is reaching 55 degrees in the afternoons. Mixed clarity depending on location. Water level is 82% and filling at approximately 6" a day. Sunset Boat ramp hours are 7 days a week, 6am-8pm. Stillwater boat ramp hours are

Friday-Sunday 6am – 8pm. Fishing for rainbow trout has been good. Target the areas with moving water. Kastmasters, Little Cleo spoons, and tungsten jigs tipped with Clam Silkie under a float are all catching fish. Brown trout action has been excellent. Look for fish along rocky shorelines, or mud lines from the wind. Crank baits, small tube jigs and larger profile spoons have been working well. Best bite is in the wind and stormy weather. Lake trout bite has been very good with fish being caught at all depths right now, but ready to move deeper as the water warms. Best action is 15-50 ft of water with white or lighter colored tube jigs and small minnow imitations. Key to catching fish is finding them, once you find them they seem eager to eat. Use your electronics or legs to cover water and locate fish. This time of year is a great time to be on the water with the multispecies action, don't miss it!! Fishing with Bernie Guide, Dan Shannon

#### 9 Track students sent to state

The West Grand Track Team sent 9 athletes to state last week and they came away with 14 state medals. On the girls side Sara Leachman finished off her sophomore season by running in the 100 and 200 prelims on Thursday. She failed to make the finals but had a solid season and was the girls leading scorer. Lillian Hufford made state for the third season and the junior placed 4th with a jump of 9-1.

The boys had an excellent state meet over 3 days placing in 4 events, earning 23 points, which placed them 16th in 2A among 71 schools. Sophomore Joe Probst qualified in 4 events. He failed to make the 300 hurdle finals but in his strongest event, the 110 High Hurdles, he made it quite interesting. In his prelims on Thursday he ran his slowest time of the season[16.57] but squeezed into the finals placing him in lane 2 of the 9 lane track. On Saturday with the huge following of Mustang fans cheering him on he responded with his 2nd best time of the season, 15.67, which earned him second place. Also individually, Wyatt Howell ran the 100 and Brayden James the 400 in prelims but failed to make the finals and Kai Edson, who had a great 3 week run of improvement winning the event in Steamboat, placing 3rd in league, and qualifying for state on his last jump at the Joe Shields, competed in the pole vault but didn't place.


The relays where the Mustangs

have shined in recent years had great results. The 4x200 relay twice broke their own school record. In the prelims on Thursday Wyatt Shearer, Joe Probst, Brayden, Whatt Howell ran 1:31.68 and then went 1:31.63 Friday to place 3rd. The same group, who broke the school record in Steamboat 3 weeks ago [44.18] ran 44.83 to make the finals and then ran 44.88 to earn 5th. The 4X400 team of James, Shearer, sophomore Cooper Martinson, and Howell ran their season best in the prelims on Friday in 3:35.18 to make the finals as the 8th seed. They then ran 3:36.45 to take 7th place to end the meet. Four of those boys had a busy 3 days with prelims and finals, as Joe Probst had 8 events, Wyatt Howell and Brayden

James had 7, and Wyatt Shearer had 6.


