Mustangs shine while breaking record set in 1992

On a beautiful, sunny day in Steamboat, the Mustangs took full advantage with 19 PRs, 6 4of4s, and 2 new school records. The girls finished with 63 points, good for 4th of 11 teams while the boys scored 100, taking 3rd. The girls had 5 top 3 finishes and the boys had 11.

The relay group of Wyatt Shearer, Joe Probst, Brayden James, and Wyatt Howell broke the 4X200 set last year in 1:32.70 with an uncontested 1:32.35. Brayden and Wyatt were on that team with Levi Edson and Ollie Bergman. The same 4 broke the 44.5 4X100 record set in 1992 by Jason Reese, Tony Manguso, Danny Giron, and Casey Curran. That was a talented group with Jason playing All-State football, Tony placing high in the 100, Danny running for the Univ. of Wyoming, and Casey playing All-State football and becoming state champ in wrestling.

This new record is a fast 44.18. As Coach Shields always said, "The only reason to keep records is so some young athlete looks up there and has that as a dream to get their

name on that board." The Mustang records are very impressive, set by many D1 and D2 future athletes.

The 4X400 relay of Brayden, both Wyatts, and Cooper Martinson crushed the field trimming 9 seconds off their best, running 3:35.80. Their relays are now ranked 2nd-2nd-7th in 2A. Also having great days for the boys, Joe took 1st in the 110HH [15.97] and 4th in the 300H 45.55, Howell 2nd in the 100 [11.52], James 1st in the 400 [52.17], Jackson Steinle 2nd in his first 200 24.49, Dean Ratcliff 2nd in the 3200 [12:00], and Kai Edson 1st in the pole vault [10-2]. Also, the 4X100 B team of Chris Wellington, Kai, Cooper, and Lawson Landrus was 2nd. The throwers' co-ed relay of Lilly Butler, Morgan Nelson, Ethan Glave, and Ryan VanOosten was 1st.

Homegrown Talent Initiative Brings Grand County Businesses and High Schoolers Together

Homegrown Talent initiative started as a statewide program that helps kids in rural areas like Grand county and others across the state to understand careers in their community and provide a sliver of what they may want to pursue after high school and build career connected students while in high school. This program started in 8 rural school districts across Colorado, two of which are in Grand county in East and West Grand school districts. The goal of HTI is to guide students into careers they found interest in and provide a way to connect with Grand County business owners and learn what it is like to work in a real world environment. Amy Chamberlain, the facilitator of the program in Grand County has helped kids in East and West grand school districts apply and work as interns with local businesses and companies

ranging from radio stations to interning and the local medical centers.

Conner Murdoch is a Senior at Middle Park, his first internship was with PJ Olson at Eagle WInd and sound during his junior year learning how to create and produce music. This year, staying in the music industry Conner was an intern at KFFR radio station mixing and talking on the air for listeners to enjoy. “I expressed to Amy that I wanted to transition into a music creation direction” in cooperation Amy and the owner of KFFR Steve Skinner created an internship that allowed conner to create music like he wanted to while complying to the HTI curriculum maximizing his interest and using the career connected strategies that HTI was built around. Conner is a strong advocate for HTI and had thai to say about his experience “It (HTI) created such a good gateway to a lot of different

things for a lot of different kids and I thinks that's extremely important for places like here (Grand County) where we live where opportunities are a little bit harder to come by”.

Grand County Advocate’s intern Josie Childers, a senior at Middle Park is on her 3rd internship and unlike Conner had three internships in three different fields working with Zach Boor at the Middle school as well as interning for a local freelance videographer. “ HTI let me experience a lot of different options and helped me find my desired career path but also taught me that it was a lot harder than I would have thought” Josie plans on Majoring in Journalism at the University of Missouri, “It (HTI) helped me become a more well rounded individual and have the clear understanding of the real world”

Personally this was how I found my way into journalism, as a

sophomore I had a sports center bit on the morning announcements and was offered the opportunity to join HTI as a journalist and now I am going to the University of Colorado next year majoring in journalism with a minor in sports media. If it wasn’t for HTI, Grand Gazette, and SKy Hi News that wouldn’t have been possible. The path that the Homegrown Talent Initiate has set me on and let me explore before graduating high school has been amazing and helped me get out of my comfort zone experiencing news in real world applications.

HTI has started a movement through grand county not only with students but businesses as well in a symbiotic relationship giving students a taste of industries in Grand county and a little extra help with their business building a greater and closer community.

A core tenet of libraries is to have a catalog of quality, topical, and entertaining books for our community. Built on this idea, Free Comic Book Day delivers just that. On the first Saturday of every May since 2002, stores throughout the nation open their doors to comic book fans of all ages and interests for free comic books. Store events are popular and get better every year. This nationwide event is a great way to get comics into the hands of new fans. Fans of the movie franchise “Guardians of the Galaxy” can explore the histories of the diverse series’ characters and join them on adventures outside the scope of the movies.

The annual event offers a wide selection of titles aimed at the broadest audience. Popular titles include staples of DC and Marvel superheroes, “Star Trek” and “Animal Crossing.” This year, Free Comic Book Day is celebrating popular video game franchises. Titles such as “Street Fighter 6 #0” and “Punch Up!” offer exciting bare-knuckle bouts fueled by revenge and destiny. “Street Fighter 6 #0” and the subsequent four volumes will feature brawling battles between art thieves, military special forces operatives, and a graffiti ninja. This story will expand upon the already fast-paced world contained within the long-running video game series.

Household names such as “The Avengers” and “Looney Toons” are popular choices at Fraser Valley Library. Comic books tend to be easy reads. However, many popular series have taken on heavy topics including politics and domestic and racial crimes. Despite all the popular films, TV shows, and video games permeating popular culture, there’s nothing that can beat a good comic book.
